Discussion:

I. Christians Find Blessings In Their Temptations (vs.12-15)

- A. Temptation is par for the course.
- B. Enduring temptation leads to God's approval.
- C. Blaming God for temptation is a foolish practice.

II. Christians Find Gifts In Their Obedience (vs.16-18)

- A. Deception can hinder our awareness.
- B. God is the giver of great gifts.
- C. God is revealing His will to mankind.

III. Christians Find Righteousness In Their Perseverance (vs.19-20)

- A. Righteousness is seen when we are quick to hear.
- B. Righteousness is seen when we are slow to speak.
- C. Righteousness is seen when we are slow to wrath.

IV. Christians Find Salvation In Their Reception (vs.21-25)

- A. The implanted word can save your soul.
- B. Become a doer, not just a hearer, to save your soul.
- C. Reflection and adjustments can save your soul.

V. Christians Find Purity In Their Hearts (vs.26-27)

- A. Vain religion includes poor commitment.
- B. Pure religion includes a personal commitment.
- C. Pure religion includes a corporate commitment.
