I. God Is In Control

Romans 8:28-29 reminds us that good comes to those that follow Him.

Philippians 4:13 convinces us that we can cope with anything because Christ is in us.

Question: Do you believe that God is all powerful and all knowing?

Question: Why do we refuse to have enough faith in Him to take care of us?

II. God Will Keep His Promises

Numbers 23:19 tells us that God cannot lie and will do what He promises do.

1 Peter 3:9 clearly teaches us that God is not slack concerning his promises.

Question: Do you believe that God will keep His promises?

Question: What has God promised His children?

III. God Will Help You

1 Corinthians 10:13 says that there is always an escape from temptation.

Hebrews 2:18 reveals that Christ understands because He overcame temptation.

Question: Do you believe that God will help you when you need Him?

Question: How can God help you?

IV. God Will Mold You Into His Image

Romans 12:1-2 challenges us to constantly be transformed by God.

Philippians 2:5 commands us to seek the mind of Jesus Christ.

Question: Do you want to become holy and Christ-like?

Question: What can you do to become more like Jesus?
