Introduction: What do you think about when you are singing hymns? We should study the hymns that we are singing and know meaning of the terms we are using to praise God. **I Corinthians 14:15-16** tells us that we should sing with the spirit and with the understanding. When we sing we should not be confused or frustrated. Nothing should hinder our worship from being done in spirit and in truth (**John 4:24**). Guerdon = REWARD

Holy Lays = PSALM

Olive's Brow = MOUNT OF OLIVES, GARDEN OF GETHSEMANE

Ether Plains = UPPER REGIONS

Panoply = COVERING OF PROTECTION

Rapture = PASSION or EXCITEMENT

Zephyrs = GENTLE BREEZE

His Hands"*
