There are 76 references to the kingdom of God in the New Testament. There are no borders or limits to the kingdom of God. Anyone can be a part of God's nation! In Christ we can become a part of the spiritual Israel. What comes next after we enter it? Our goal is to bring all nations back together under one banner... the banner of the cross.
