Text: Luke 10:25-37

Introduction: Last Sunday morning we considered the story of Jonah. We talked about how our mission for God, like the mission of Jonah, is more successful when we have a strong commitment to the task set before us. One of the thoughts that I brought out, but didn't flesh out, was the idea of how the heart of God needs to be center of our lives....not just the message on our lips. There are some great Bible stories that reinforce this thought. Let's open our Bibles and read a familiar text together....
