- 2. We have to take an honest approach to life!
- 3. We must not forget that we do live in a world filled with conflict.
- 4. We are broken people that are not perfect.
- 5. How can we resolve our conflicts?

Discussion:

- I. PRAY Talk to God first James 4:1-2, 5:16
- II. BELIEVE Remember that everyone can change Acts 9:1-20, Acts 15:36-41, II Timothy 4:11
- III. GO Always take the initiative Matthew 5:23-24, 18:15-17
- IV. CONFESS Confess your part of the problem Matthew 7:1-5, James 5:16
- V. CONFRONT Attack the problem not the person Proverbs 15:1, Ephesians 4:29
- VI. WATCH Be loving, honest, and assertive in your approach Galatians 6:1-2, Colossians 3:12-15
- VII. LISTEN Use your ears more than your mouth Romans 15:1-3, Philippians 2:4
- VIII. RESOLVE Practice cooperation and compromise when needed Romans 12:18, I Corinthians 8:1-13
- IX. FORGIVE If the person is willing to repent you must forgive them Luke 17:3-4, Acts 7:60
- X. FORGET You must learn to move on and shake the dust Matthew 18:21-35, I John 2:9-11

Conclusion:

- 1. We must find a way to get along with one another.
- 2. We have to learn to lay down our pride and handle our conflicts.
- 3. We cannot forget that the two greatest commandments are to love the Lord with all our heart, soul, mind and strength. . . . and to love our neighbor as ourselves (**Matthew 22:37-39**).
- 4. And we are commanded to love our enemies (Mathew 5:44).
