Introduction: The calming of the storm is found in three gospels (**Matthew 8:23-27, Mark 4:37-41, Luke 8:22-25**). Tonight we will study the events in the gospel of Mark. John Mark reveals that they had a busy day of teaching and ministry. They were probably exhausted. However, the ministry of Jesus was only beginning. They were headed to a new work. Let's study together...

If we are looking for mercy and grace to help in time of need we need to turn to Jesus (**Hebrews 4:14-16, 7:25**). Are you ready for the “greatest” storm (**II Peter 3:7-12, II Corinthians 5:10**)? If you take the steps necessary for salvation you can have safety through this storm!
