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WELCOME TO T.I.T.U.S. CAMP

Thank you for joining us for T.I.T.U.S. Camp, a spiritually focused leadership camp that has drawn young Christians to Heritage Christian University from across the country for the past 11 years. Since this camp was founded, in 2005, over 107 congregations of the Lord's people have been impacted by the teens trained at T.I.T.U.S. Camp. We have witnessed the spiritual growth of 254 students from 12 states in the past decade. Many of those young people have chosen ministry, missions, and Christian education after graduation to further their Christian service. We are so proud of their work!

Each year we choose a timely theme to help us focus on training for the Lord's service. This year's theme for TITUS Camp is "**Prayer Warriors.**" We will consider several great Bible characters that believed in the power of prayer. The young men will be reviewing the prayer life of Moses, David, Elijah, and Daniel. The young ladies will be reviewing the prayer life of Hannah, Anna, Deborah & Mary. Each camper will be given the opportunity to study one specific character (listed above) and deliver a lesson, on that person's prayer life, to a local congregation.

Twenty-two Shoals area churches have hosted our students over the years. This year we will be visiting eight congregations: Center Hill church of Christ (Florence), Cloverdale church of Christ (Cloverdale), East Colbert church of Christ (Muscle Shoals), Eastwood church of Christ (Florence), Florence Blvd. church of Christ (Florence), Jackson Heights church of Christ (Florence), Pine Hill church of Christ (Waterloo), and Salem church of Christ (Florence). We are proud to have the unwavering support of these congregations! The church families at Pine Hill and Eastwood have supported the camp since our foundation.

In order to aid our own spiritual journey this week we will consider different kinds of prayers for our Manna in the Morning sessions (i.e. conviction, dedication, supplication, appreciation, consecration, and intercession). Each afternoon we will have chapel speeches from our staff members on the armor necessary to be a warrior in the Army of God (i.e. helmet, breastplate, belt, shield, sword, and shoes). Every evening we will have our "Power Hour" devotionals introducing other great aspects of being a prayer warrior. Guest speakers will direct our minds toward great Bible stories that show us the power of prayer (i.e. the whole armor of God, the persistent widow, the apostle Paul, Abraham, Solomon, Hezekiah, and Jesus).

Studying about becoming a great prayer warrior, and reflecting on the lives of other prayer warriors, is just the beginning. We want to seek application of what we have learned. Therefore, campers and counselors will be given a prayer journal at the beginning of the week. Each day we will have quiet time for prayer and meditation along with journal topics. Take advantage of that opportunity to draw close to God. We will also take prayer requests in the chapel every day and lift those names/situations up in prayer. One mid-week service will also include a prayer walk around the campus to encourage us to think about our own spiritual journey. We will spend one evening signing prayer cards for those who need encouragement. And, we will also visit some local nursing homes to pray for those who are shut-in and discouraged.

It is my prayer that this theme, study, fellowship, Christian environment, and spiritual atmosphere will help us become the warriors God has called us to be in His kingdom. There is no doubt in my mind that we have the power to change the world! John said, "He who is in you is greater than he who is in the world" (**I John 4:4**). This is why Paul tells us that God's Spirit helps us when we are weak, makes intercession for us, works things together for good, and is on our side (**Romans 8:26-39**). This is our time! This is our chance to make a difference. Let's be noble, bold, and courageous prayer warriors! May God bless our week!

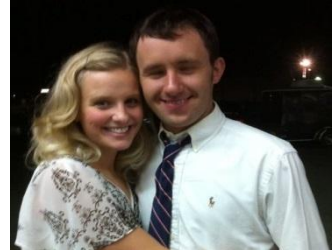

T.I.T.U.S. CAMP RULES

CONDUCT

(1) *Proper Behavior*

We expect all campers to display Christ-like behavior.

No fighting, arguing, pranks, rough housing, or unnecessary horseplay.

We will not tolerate bullies or pranks at TITUS Camp!

(2) *Proper Attitude*

We expect all campers to have a positive attitude.

All campers are encouraged to act in a mature manner.

(3) *Proper Speech*

We will not tolerate any cursing or suggestive speech at any time.

You will season your speech with love and grace.

(4) *Respect*

You must have respect for the camp leadership and other campers.

Remember to be courteous (i.e. Yes, Ma'am or Yes, Sir).

(5) *Activities*

When we leave the campus you must stay with the group.

Do not wander off and do not go anywhere on your own.

(6) *Only Supervised Gender Mixing*

Do not go off alone with another camper of the opposite gender.

No excessive hugging, holding hands, or arms around each other.

Absolutely no kissing! PDA can lead to your dismissal.

Girls are never allowed in the boys sleeping areas.

Boys are never allowed in the girls sleeping areas.

(7) *Work Detail*

All campers will help to serve the meals (see *Work Detail*, pg. 27).

There will be assigned chores (i.e. clean-up bathrooms, hallways, chapel, grounds, etc.).

(8) *Weapons*

No weapons are allowed at camp. Period.

Any knives, guns, stun guns, or other weapons will lead to your dismissal.

AGENDA

(1) *Wake-Up*

You will get up at 7:00 AM each morning with a smile!

You will be at "Manna in the Morning" on time each day.

(2) *Schedule/Time*

Make sure that you are early or on time for each class and activity.

Familiarize yourself with the schedule.

If you are repeatedly late you will be disciplined or sent home.

(3) *Breaks*

We will give you several breaks throughout the day.

Do not ask to be dismissed from a class unless it is an emergency.

(4) *Teachers*

You will show respect to the staff and the teachers especially.

They have donated their time and talents to this camp.

HOUSEKEEPING

(1) Bed

Please make your bed and clean up your area each day.
If you refuse to keep a neat area you will have additional chores.
We will have dorm inspection each day to check up on your assigned areas.

(2) Personal Items

Keep all of your personal items in your suitcase and stored away.
Do not touch another person's belongings for any reason.

(3) Hygiene/Cleanliness

You are required to take a shower and brush your teeth every day.
If you need soap or shampoo arrangements can be made.
Your hair must be combed, or brushed, and neatly styled.

(4) On-Campus

You must stay on campus unless we are going in vans to a group activity.
Do not ever leave the campus during the camp (counselors must check in/out).
You need to respect the buildings and keep them clean at all times.

(5) Bathrooms

Bathrooms/showers in the activity building will be temporarily marked for our use.
You may use those showers from 6:00-7:30 AM and 9:30-11:00 PM.
Don't leave the bathrooms messy! Clean up by picking up toiletry items and hanging towels.

(6) Sleeping

Go to bed on time (check the notebooks and you will see a specific time for "Lights Out").
If you are tired you will not perform well or enjoy the camp.
Do not bother or pester one another while sleeping.

(7) Personal Space

Space is limited, but each person will be given a designated area.
Be considerate of one another. Let them sleep!

(8) Dorm Inspection

Each morning the directors will be inspecting the dorm rooms (see *Dorm Inspection*, pg. 26).
The worst living area will receive additional clean-up for that day.

DRESS CODE

(1) Professionalism

Guys must wear dress slacks, khakis, and nice collared shirts on campus.
Guys must wear coats and/or ties on Sunday morning.
Girls must wear dresses, dress slacks, capris, or pant suits while on campus.
Girls must follow the "credit card" strap rule on all dresses, blouses, and shirts.
You must dress your best when you go out for worship on Sunday.
Your mentors will help if you have questions about the dress code, or ask you to change.

(2) Modesty

When we leave on activities you may wear knee length shorts and t-shirts.
We will tell you when there is a designated time for shorts (i.e. after rest time).
Please be cautious about items that are too tight, too short, or otherwise inappropriate.

(3) Content on Clothing

Do not wear clothing with logos or advertising for tobacco and/or alcohol.
Any clothing with negative or suggestive language will be confiscated.

(4) *Activities*

Campers are allowed to dress casual for all activities and down time.

Modest dress is required for all off campus trips (see above).

We will get wet on Saturday, so shorts are permitted with t-shirts (not white).

(5) *Jewelry*

All campers and counselors are encouraged to wear their nametags.

Please do not wear necklaces, bracelets, or ear-rings in the pulpit (Guys).

Exceptions will be made if bracelets are for emergency usage.

OTHER

(1) *Director's Privilege*

All rules are subject to change without notice.

If you have any problems or any questions see the director.

(2) *Cell Phones & Electronics*

Cell phones and electronic devices must be turned off and given to your counselor.

Students must not use cell phones during the day time hours (including rest time).

Do not use the internet on your phone or personal computer without permission.

Do not call anyone at anytime without permission from the camp leadership.

Any calls made on campus must be with a calling card or phone card.

You may only call home each evening to check in with your parents.

There will be a set time for those calls (usually 7-7:45 AM and 9-10 PM).

If you have an emergency or urgent necessity, please notify a counselor.

(3) *Off Limits*

Please do not touch someone else's cell phone or computer.

Please stay away from all the stoves, fire extinguishers, thermostats and sound equipment.

Please do not get into suitcases or bags that do not belong to you.

Please do not enter any class rooms or offices unless you are supervised.

Please do not ask the director to change any of these rules.

(4) *Visitors*

We want to avoid having "pop-in" visitors during the camp session.

Family and alumni will be invited to the evening POWER HOUR sessions.

Everyone will be invited to the Sunday afternoon graduation.

Please do not invite people to camp while we are in session.

(5) *Food*

In an effort to be healthier we will have salad available at lunch and dinner.

We will also have fresh fruit available at each meal time.

Peanut butter and jelly will be an alternative for lunch and dinner.

(6) *Discipline*

If anyone violates the rules it can result in your immediate dismissal.

Please do not put us in a position to send you home.

We do not want to have to send anyone home from camp.

(7) *WWJD Rule – The Golden Rule*

The most important rule is to treat others like Jesus (**Matthew 7:12**).

Be kind to one another and love one another.

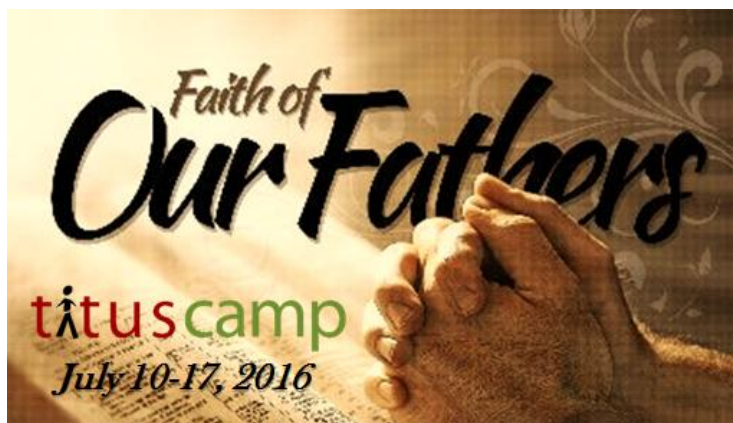
A Look Ahead to 2016
