Why do we need to study Christian apologetics?

- > Because **Jesus** wanted people to believe in Him based on the facts of what He had done (John 11:25-26, 12:24-26).
- > Because **Luke** was convinced that eyewitness testimony, and careful history would help aid our faith (Luke 1:1-4, Acts 1:1-3).
- > Because **Paul** spent the latter part of his life explaining and proving that Jesus was the Messiah by defending the truth (Acts 17:2-4).
- > Because **Peter** wanted Christians to "<u>always</u> be ready to give a reason" for our faith in Jesus with humility and respect (I Peter 3:15).
- > Because **Jude** told believers to "contend for the faith" (**Jude 3**) when people challenged the truth.

"But sanctify the Lord God in your hearts, and always be ready to give a defense to everyone who asks you a reason for the hope that is in you, with meekness and fear." (I Peter 3:15)

Three basic questions we need to answer:

- 1) Is there a God?
- 2) Who is God?
- 3) What does God expect of me?

What do you believe? Why do you believe it?

Scientists use faith & assumption to argue their hypothesis. The Scriptures offer us evidence, eyewitness testimony, etc. Scientists use faith in the following areas:

- 1) The order of the universe
- 2) Absolute & objective truth
- 3) Reliability of the senses
- 4) Repetition of laboratory experiments

Science gives us the "Know How," but Scripture gives us the "Know Why."

What do people believe? Can we define our terms?

- Atheism = There is no God.
- Agnosticism = Do not care if there is a God.
- Theism = There IS a God who is active.
- Deism = There is a God who is not active.
- Gradualism = There is a God who wound up an evolutionary clock.
- Raelianism = There is no God, but we are a seed race from another world.

How can we accelerate the conversation?

- 1) More education.
- 2) Less criticism.
- *3) Prayer for intervention.*

What are the current trends? Is science moving closer to Scripture?

- Scientists are looking to the stars for evidence and answers to their questions.
- The universe must have had a beginning (Colossians 1:16-17, II Timothy 1:9).
- Time had a beginning (**John 1:1-3**).
- Something/Someone must have caused effects before time (**Genesis 1:1**).
- Something/Someone must be fine tuning cosmic events (Deuteronomy 30:11-14, Nehemiah 9:6).
- God MUST NOT be left out of a scientific debate!
