Introduction: Clark Kent was NOT a real “Miracle Man.” However, there is one who has defied gravity, walked on water, healed the sick, and raised the dead (John 3:2, 11:47). That man was & is Jesus Christ! Tonight we are beginning a new series on the miracles of Jesus. Let’s study together.

II. The Fear Behind The Miracles of Jesus

A. Jesus Has Authority Over Nature

1. The winds and waves obey Him
Calming the storm (Matthew 8:23-27; Mark 4:37-41; Luke 8:22-25), Walking on water (Matthew 14:22-32; Mark 6:47-52; John 6:16-21)
2. The plants, trees and creatures obey Him
Feeding 5,000 (Matthew 14:14-21; Mark 6:30-44; Luke 9:10-17; John 6:1-14), Feeding 4,000 (Matthew 15:32-39; Mark 8:1-9), Fish with coin (Matthew 17:24-27), Fig tree withers (Matthew 21:18-22; Mark 11:12-14, 20-25), Huge catch of fish (Luke 5:4-11; John 21:1-11), Water into wine (John 2:1-11)

B. Jesus Has Authority Over Infirmities

1. Sickness is dispelled in His presence or at His word
Man with leprosy (Matthew 8:1-4; Mark 1:40-44; Luke 5:12-14), Roman centurion’s servant (Matthew 8:5-13; Luke 7:1-10), Peter’s mother-in-law (Matthew 8:14-15; Mark 1:30-31; Luke 4:38-39), Man with palsy (Matthew 9:2-7; Mark 2:3-12; Luke 5:18-26), Woman with bleeding (Matthew 9:20-22; Mark 5:25-34; Luke 8:43-48), Canaanite woman’s daughter (Matthew 15:21-28; Mark 7:24-30), Crippled woman (Luke 13:10-17), Man with dropsy (Luke 14:1-4), Ten men with leprosy (Luke 17:11-19), Nobleman’s son at Capernaum (John 4:46-54), Sick man at the pool of Bethesda (John 5:1-15)
2. Demons flee in His presence or at His word
Two men possessed with demons (Matthew 8:28-34; Mark 5:1-15; Luke 8:27-39), A mute demon-possessed man (Matthew 9:32-33), A boy with a demon (Matthew 17:14-21; Mark 9:17-29; Luke 9:38-43), Demon-possessed man in synagogue (Mark 1:21-28; Luke 4:31-37)
3. The senses are alert in His presence or at His word
Two blind men (Matthew 9:27-31), Two more blind men (Matthew 20:29-34; Mark 10:46-52; Luke 18:35-43), Blind man at Bethesda (Mark 8:22-26), The high priest’s servant (Luke 22:50-51), A man born blind (John 9:1-41)

C. Jesus Has Authority Over Death

1. The death of others
Jairus’ daughter (Matthew 9:18-26; Mark 5:21-43; Luke 8:40-56), The widow’s son at Nain (Luke 7:11-17), Lazarus, the friend of Jesus (John 11:1-44)
2. His own death (John 10:18, I John 3:16)

III. The Feelings Behind The Miracles of Jesus

- A. Compassion to handle problems without (Mark 3:7-12)
- B. Compassion to handle problems within (Mark 5:21-43)
- C. Compassion to handle community problems (Mark 6:45-56)
- D. Compassion to handle faith problems (Mark 8:22-26)
- E. Compassion to handle family problems (Mark 10:13-16)
- F. Compassion to handle global problems (Mark 16:15-18)

Conclusion: Jesus never performed a miracle to serve Himself. What can you learn about Jesus, the miracle Man? He is “Supraman!” Consider all of the signs, wonders, and mighty works of God. Our God is an AWESOME God! Who will you tell about the miracles of Jesus?
